From Our President



Although painting demonstration done via Zoom are efficient and have certain advantages, most will argue there is nothing quite as rewarding as a live demonstration. Two more Zoom demonstrations are scheduled; one for May 20th (Kelsey Birsa) and the second on June 17th (Susan Kuznitsky). We are scheduling demos back to back as July and August have traditionally been set aside for summer activities rather than meetings.

Liz Walker, who creates award-winning acrylic and marbled paintings in her home studio in the Portland, Oregon area has been painting and teaching throughout Oregon and Washington for nearly 20 years. Abstracted figures that convey a sense of "story" are her favorite subject matter, and she produces hundreds of paintings each year.

For the past several years, Liz's paintings have been consistently juried into several consecutive national shows. Using a digital presentation/lecture format, Liz will reveal some of the practices and habits that catapulted her work to greater recognition among jurors. She will emphasize the importance of embracing one's artistic influences — past and present — and show how doing so can improve your own artistic growth.

Join Liz as she takes you on a visual adventure — charting her creative journey through use of images, ideas, and sage advice she's gleaned from other artists.



ABOUT LIZ:

Liz Walker received her BA in Art from Trinity University in San Antonio, TX. Her work has been exhibited widely in regional and national shows, and she received First Place in the 47th Annual Rocky Mountain Watermedia Show this year. Watercolor Artist Magazine featured an article about Liz's acrylic marbling technique in their Aug. 2016 issue and her paintings have been published in the North Light publications AcrylicWorks4 and AcrylicWorks6. Introducing Kirby Kahl, a new addition to SWA's social media/publicity team

Kirby Kahl is an abstract, intuitive artist currently based in Washougal, Washington. When Kirby isn't painting, she's often found writing or in the outdoors rock climbing, hiking, or skiing. Her love for the outdoors spills into her creative practice with the occasional landscape artwork.

Kirby predominantly worked in the digital world as a video editor and photographer before shifting into the world of acrylics. Her work is intuitive, expressive, and alive with color. Often inspired by the tiniest of flowers popping up in the middle of a field, or an odd rock found on an adventure; each painting captures a feeling, or a moment in time that was once fleeting but now alive, eternally. While Kirby plays in many styles, she does a lot of acrylic pouring. Acrylic pouring is often considered wasteful but Kirby finds joy in finding ways to repurpose materials and paint. She can be found painting with rubber spatulas, pieces of plastic, cardboard, and other experimental materials as she develops a piece. Her practice is as experimental as it is expressive and while she has a signature style in her acrylic pours, she enjoys experimentation too much to be bogged down into any one category.

The CASE Act, providing a means for individual creators to bring small infringement cases, is now law

After over 15 years of advocacy, the Copyright Alternative in Small-Claims law passed as part of the comprehensive omnibus bill in late 2020. It may take 12–18 months for the copyright small claims tribunal to be up and running and processes to be in place. In the meantime the Graphic Artist Guild suggests artists register their copyrights, that having registered for copyright on their works will be a prerequisite to using the tribunal. PROSPECTUS & CALL FOR ARTISTS

Criteria For Art:

Accepted art will be unique, original art that is primarily aesthetic in its intent and purpose. No work copied from old masters or from copyrighted or published materials without permission. No work produced in step by step instruction classes. No reproductions except for digital copies submitted for virtual display.

Art must not have been previously judged in an SWA Show.

Show managers reserve the right to determine whether art meets the criteria.

Art will be separated into 3 categories for viewing and judging. 1- oil and acrylic on canvas, 2- watercolor and acrylic on paper, 3- all other mediums. Art may not exceed 36" x 36" including frame.

- Members: \$25 first entry and \$5 each additional piece (up to 3 pieces)
- Non-Members \$35 first entry and \$5 each additional piece (up to 3 pieces)

Registration closes March 24, or when 200 pieces are received.

Registration fee will be invoiced via Paypal. Payment is due upon receipt. All registrations not paid by April 2 will be void.

Judge Karen Madsen will select 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 2 Honorable Mention award winners in the following 3 categories: 1- oil and acrylic on canvas, 2- watercolor and acrylic on paper, 3- all other mediums. Artists whose pieces receive awards must drop them off at Camas Gallery, 408 NE 4th Ave, Camas, WA on Tuesday May 4, 2021. Winners will be on display till May 31 st. Artwork must be labeled on the back with the artists' name, title, medium, price and be appropriately wired and ready to hang. Any questions, contact <u>SWA at info@swavancouver.com</u>.

Best of Show - \$500 prize, plus additional cash prizes in the 3 categories. First, Second, and Third Place. People's Choice Award will be polled online only.

Sales:

By registering for this show, the artist grants SWA the exclusive right to sell their work(s) consigned for the Open Virtual Spring Show during the show period April 15 through May 31, 2021, unless the work is marked "Not for Sale". The artist is responsible for delivery of sold art. Curbside pickup in the Camas. WA area will be arranged by the artist with the buyer. Should shipping be required the artist is responsible for packing and shipping the art and obtaining reimbursement (if desired) from the buyer. A receipt for curbside pickup or shipment will be provided by the artist to SWA. SWA will retain 50% of the sale price and the artist will be paid 50% of the sale amount within 30 days of SWA receiving proof of delivery. SWA will pay WA sales tax.
