As it has been the last two years, registration is solely online. There are many reasons to use online registration. One is because it is instant and accessible to the whole registration committee, and two because prepaying makes art delivery day go so much smoother - no more waiting in lines while the registration table types away and prints receipts. And three, this way the data that you input (art titles, media, etc.) are never retyped - they go straight from the website to the spreadsheet that we use to print labels and programs - preventing "typos" and other misprints (mostly).

If you have trouble registering online, bring your art or photos of your art to this **February** meeting and **someone will help you register and pay**.

About our February Art Demonstration: Elaine Pawski

Our own Elaine Pawski is an expert on using her iPad to make art and/ or assist her with making physical art. She currently is teaching a series on iPad art at OSA. We have invited her to show you a few tricks that you can use to elevate your art whether you are interested in digital art or not.

Elaine will be showing you various ways that drawing and painting on your iPad can support and help with your natural media work. She will be showing us several tips and tricks for creating preliminary studies and planning your compositions, colors and values.



We all get stuck on a painting, leave it unfinished while we wonder what direction to go forward in. As a group, we will critique one such painting and Elaine will demonstrate how she can make those changes on a photograph of the painting BEFORE making changes to the actual painting.

SWA General Meeting Minutes for January 18th, 2020

The meeting, held in room 103 of the Frost Building at Clark College, was called to order by President Janice Tracy. This was a Saturday meeting designed to attract those members who are unable to attend a regular Wednesday meeting.

Guests and new members were introduced.

Treasurer, Linda Whittingham, reported a balance of \$12,059.59 In all accounts.

Katey Sandy talked about the Spring Show which will be April 30-May 3 at the Water Resources Center. Take in date will be April 28. On-line registration opens February 1. An artist may enter up to three pieces, providing photos of the works when registering. The show will be limited to 200 pieces. Help is needed to put on the show including a website manager, show sitters and sponsors. Registration assistance will be available at the February general meeting on February 19, which will be held at the usual meeting place and time. Karen Madsen has been selected as show judge.

Wanda Brewster will be in charge of the silent auction and contributions from members are needed to make baskets for the auction. Items for the auction have already been received from art materials suppliers.

Janice announced that by May, she will be living in Sisters Oregon.

The next Board meeting will be Thursday, January 30, 10 am at the Hall Building. The February meeting will be February 19 at the Methodist Church, the March meeting will be at Clark College, room 103 in the Frost Building.

Demonstrator for the day was Karen Madsen who talked about making gesso for canvases. The gesso is made from rabbit skin glue and marble dust. These supplies can be found on the internet from various suppliers. She emphasized the need to apply the gesso, sand when dry and repeat the process ten times to produce a luminous surface for painting.

The next general meeting will be February 19 at 10 am at the Methodist Church.
